- We remain in a national lockdown so children should not be mixing with one another outside of school unless ONE support bubble for childcare has been established.



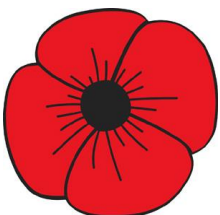
This week has been national antibullying week and we have linked this to our values of caring and altruism.
