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Remote Learning

Dear Parents and Carers

I am writing to update you on how we are looking to further improve our remote learning. I would like to start by saying thank you; this situation is far from ideal but remains necessary due to the current spread of infection.

As we continue to learn remotely we have decided that children will receive feedback on their learning in the following ways:

Reception: Teachers will continue to write individual comments on quizzes and uploaded pieces including photos.

Years 1 and 2: Teachers will continue responding to questions asked and provide verbal feedback in the live afternoon feedback sessions from Monday - Thursday. Please note these sessions are recorded onto the Google drive. Teachers will also write a written comment on one piece of writing per week.

Years 3, 4, 5 and 6: Teachers will continue responding to questions asked on Google Classroom and provide verbal feedback in the live afternoon feedback sessions from Monday - Thursday. Please note these sessions are recorded onto the Google drive. Teachers will also write a written comment on one piece of writing per week.

Teachers will respond to comments raised between 8:30-3:30. If you submit a query on Google Classroom outside of these hours it will be responded to the following day (between Monday and Friday).

To support children with identifying written feedback and responses to their questions we will be enabling pupil Gmail accounts. They will receive an alert which will take them to their feedback. These accounts will only be able to receive emails from school selected sources including Google Classroom and will not send any emails your child attempts to send.

We also ask that children take the opportunity to complete the following **daily**:

-To watch **Newsround** as this was part of their in school class learning and an appropriate way to develop their general knowledge of the wider world: <https://www.bbc.co.uk/newsround>.

-To complete some kind of **physical activity**. This can be done at home and range from the online Joe Wicks workout or going for a walk. The CBBC website has lots of remote learning activities the children can complete, including celebrity workouts and learning ideas across all subjects.
