The Daily Mile

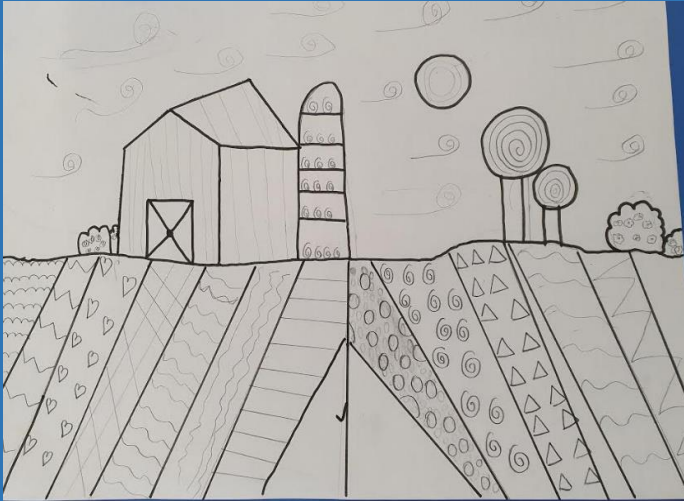


Today pupils and staff took part in the national day for Run A Mile, which has been organised to celebrate the positive benefits that daily activity can have on our mental health.
