Diversity and Inclusion through the Curriculum



This year's main school priority is diversity and inclusion through the curriculum. All schools are looking at ways to best promote and ensure that their curriculum is diverse and reflects all groups.

Staff have worked to ensure that all subjects are culturally and socially diverse and that all bias is addressed.

We have resourced our curriculum with a wide range of fiction and nonfiction that reflects the make up of our school community.

In all year groups there is a focus on significant people that have had an impact on the UK through their work. These include writers, athletes, inventors, artists, scientists, leaders, activists and historical figures. The children will be learning about their work and their impact on society.

For example, when we focussed on the success of Emma Radacanu in the US Open we also looked at Althea Gibson, a former female Wimbledon Champion and told her story:

Parking

Charville After School Club (CAST)

We made the difficult decision in July to close our after-school wrap around care provision as uptake was very low and it became financially unviable.

Parent feedback has shown that there is demand for this to reopen and last week we issued a letter and Google form link for those that wanted this facility to go online and book sessions.

We set out new terms and conditions to ensure financial viability.

Based on bookings received we are unable to reopen CAST Club as there is not sufficient demand to make it break even.

I would like to thank those that did sign up and apologise that we are not able to proceed.

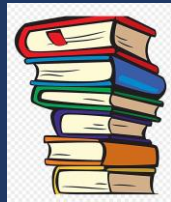

At Charville we believe that English is the foundation of the children's curriculum throughout the school.

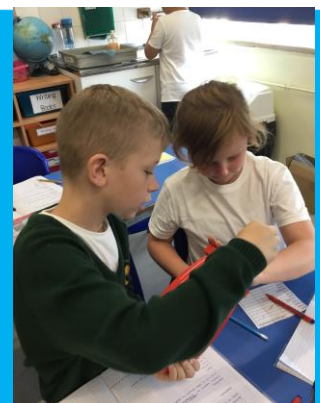
To promote this we installed a Reading Vending Machine in our canteen. The vending machine works like any other with the exception that it is filled with books! On Monday morning, each year group chooses one child who has shown to be a Reading Champion over the week who is then presented with a Reading Champion Certificate during our Pupil of the Week assembly. The pupil can demonstrate these skills through continued reading, challenging themselves with reading or showing a love of reading in class or at home.
