On Monday we welcomed all the children back to school after half term.

This term we are preparing to continue as we have been during the last half term but do ask that you continue to monitor your child for symptoms of COVID.

We will be asking you for your child's symptoms when you report them as absent. If your child presents with a high temperature or has a dry persistent cough they will still require a PCR test and cannot be in school. If their results are negative they can return but if they are positive they must isolate.

Siblings and household members who DO NOT have symptoms DO NOT have to isolate unless they develop symptoms. They would then also need to be tested.

We are planning to perform all our Christmas performances to you as a live audience but please note that we are monitoring the COVID situation carefully. If required, we will revert to recording the performances and sending them to you to watch. We hope this will not be needed and will keep you informed.

It takes many forms and can include:

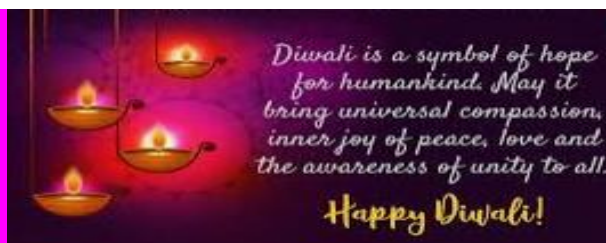
- physical assault
