On Friday 28th January we took part in a football tournament at the QPR ground. We were selected, along with 21 other London schools based on our current success in the local school league.

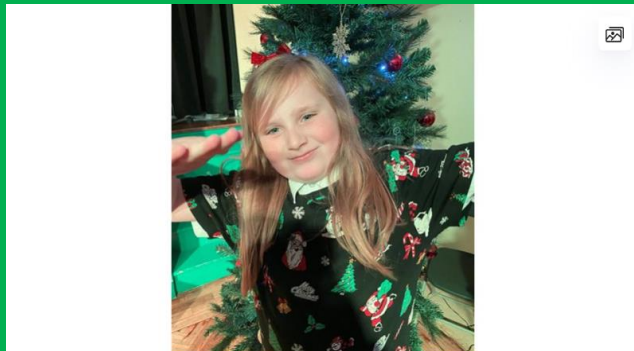
