We wish all the mums and grandmas a very happy Mother's Day on Sunday.

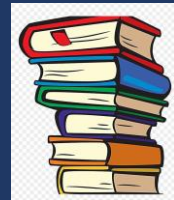


FULL GOVERNING BOARD MEETING
