



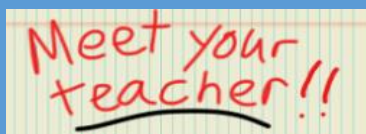

Year 6 SATs Results

On Tuesday we received our SATs results and are delighted to be able to share the following with you.

**Reading: 76% achieved Expected Standard.
2% above the national average**

**27% achieved Greater Depth Standard (we
await confirmation of the national average)**

**Writing: 85% achieved Expected Standard.
16% above the national average**

**20% achieved Greater Depth Standard (we
await confirmation of the national average)**

**Maths: 91% achieved Expected Standard.
20% above the national average**

**40% achieved Greater Depth Standard (we
await confirmation of the national average)**

**Grammar: 81% achieved Expected Standard.
9% above the national average**

**13% achieved Greater Depth Standard (we
await confirmation of the national average)**

**76% of children achieved Expected Standard
in Reading, Writing and Maths combined;
this is 17% above the national average.**

These children experienced two years of disruption to their education and we are so proud of their achievements. Thanks to all the staff who have supported their primary education and a huge thank you to the Year 6 team.

Notice for all parents: Establishment of a Specialist Resource Provision at Charville

This is an informal notice of a change to our school. The full consultation will take place in Autumn Term 2022.

We are very pleased to announce that we have been approved by the Local Authority of Hillingdon to open a Specialist Resource Provision (SRP) at Charville Academy. We are hoping, following a full consultation, to open our SRP in September 2023.

Places at the SRP would be managed by the Local Authority as all the children would have an Educational Health Care Plan (EHCP) and a diagnosis of Autism.

This is a very exciting opportunity for the school and it does mean that we will be required to make significant changes to the current building and this will involve resiting of some current classrooms but these will remain within the current building.

We will keep you updated and if you have any questions at this stage please do ask.
