ATTENDANCE

This year's annual attendance is below the national target of 95%. This will remain a key priority for next academic year.

If you need any support with your child's attendance we are here to help.

We do work closely with the Local Authority's Participation Team and will continue to do so into next academic year. Research shows that good attendance at school significantly improves your chances of leaving school with 5 or more GCSEs, which is one measure of how best to improve your child's life chances.

If your attendance is 95.1% to 100% your chances are 69.4% (You are an odds-on favourite)

If your attendance is 90.1% to 95% your chances are 51.2% (You have significantly less chance)

If your attendance is 85.1% to 90% your chances are 28.2% (You are an outsider)

Drop Off Arrangements for September: 8:40-8:50



- Nursery and Reception: Arrival via the Early Years Gate on Bury Avenue. Parent/s can accompany the child to the class doors. *Please note that 30-hour Nursery children arrive between 9:00-9:05 unless they have paid for the additional hours.*
- Years 1-2: Arrival via the Community Centre Gate. Teachers will be waiting on the KS1 playground (by the external doors) to greet the children. Parents will not need to come onto the playground.
- Year 3, 4 and 6: Arrival via any of the main gates. Please note the nearest entrance is either the Langdale Gate or the Children's Centre gate. Parents will not come onto the playground.
- Year 5: Arrival via any of the main gates. Please note the nearest entrance is via the Community Centre gate. Parents will not come onto the playground.

If you have any Charville uniform that your child will not need next year please donate to school as we can always make good use of it.



An Invitation to Years 4-6 pupils and their Parents/Carers:
