Register of People with Significant Control

A person with significant control (PSC) is someone who owns or controls a company. They're sometimes called 'beneficial owners'.

Companies must identify their PSC and tell Companies House who they are. A company can have one or more PSCs.

Companies must record their details on their company's PSC register. If a company cannot identify a PSC, or do not have one, they still need to tell Companies House.

Whilst there are a number of indicators that a person has significant control most PSCs are those who hold:

- more than 25% of shares in the company
- more than 25% of voting rights in the company
- the right to appoint or remove the majority of the board of directors

We have considered the indicators alongside our memorandum and Articles of Association and our register is as below
