



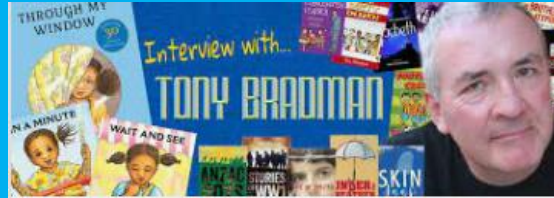

Tony Bradman- Author Visit

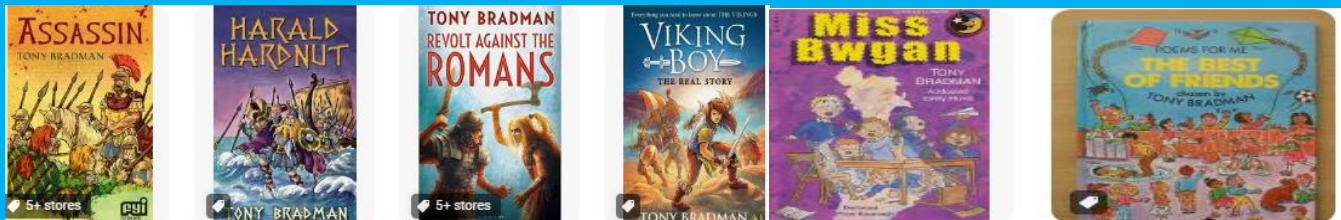


We will be celebrating World Book Day on the 10th March and Tony Bradman (children's author) will be joining us.
