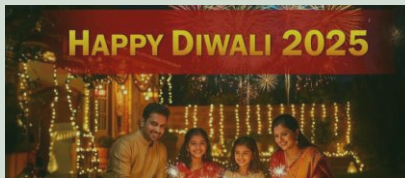
Football
