Welcome to this week's newsletter.

This week is national **Anti-Bullying** week and an opportunity for all schools to focus on what bullying is, the impact it has and how to address it.

During this week's assembly we spoke to the children about Anti Bullying Week and took time to define what bullying is and how it makes people feel.

At Charville we teach the children using the STOP sign, which stands for **Several Times On Purpose**. This helps children understand that bullying is not an isolated incident or something that could be accidental.

This year's theme is The Power of Good and is designed to support children and young people to safely speak up and raise awareness of their face to face and online bullying.

The children have been taught that bullying often happens on line and they have all been told to report anything they read, watch or hear that makes them feel uncomfortable and not to delete it until an adult has seen it.

Thank you to Miss Walker who shared book titles with the teachers to share with their classes that reinforce the messages around the impact of bullying.

School attendance is a national issue, post pandemic, and we are keen to implement a policy that includes the statutory information but that also works for families and school.



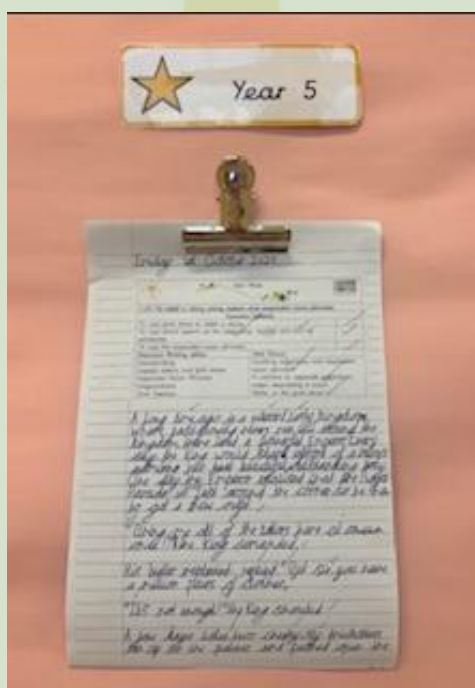
Star Write
