Stephen Hawking's: Factfile

Early Life

Stephen Hawking was born on the 8th of January 1942, Oxford (England). Hawking was interested in Maths and science but also his friends called him Einstein. In 1956, Hawking went Oxford University which did not have a ^{maths} dept at the time, and he started to like physics instead. In 1963, Hawking was diagnosed with a disease called Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis or -it was a fatal disease- or ALS. Hawking

sat in a motorised wheelchair, which had a motor inside, and he couldn't speak anymore (also he couldn't use his fingers, so he used his cheek muscles to communicate with others).

Key Achievements

Hawking was a well-respected scientist who was the first person to get the Albert Einstein Medal in 1979, he discovered that black holes have radiation. He wrote all of it in a book (that became the best selling). He had discovered that black holes are very strong in gravity and mass.

Contribution to Science

As a famous Scientist, he helped other people to understand about universe and how it works in reality. Hawking, who was a well-known genius, inspired people to study physics and science and the fundamental law of the universe. Even though his ALS caused him not to do his favourite things, Hawking never gave up his desire to do sciences and physics. †
